Promoting Indoor and On-water Rowing for Health, Fitness, Competition and Education For All Ages; For All Levels of Physical Ability

The *Adaptive Initiative* can trace its roots to August 16, 2004 when, upon the encouragement of **CIRC**, Illinois Lt. Governor Pat Quinn introduced Dr. Ed Melian on the banks of the Chicago River during his press conference on water quality. As an adaptive sculling competitor, Dr. Melian spoke eloquently of the need to develop inclusive programming with emphasize on-water accessibility for the disabled whether their interest be recreational or competitive. His words could not have been timelier.

The first championship adaptive rowing events were held in 2002 during the *FISA World Championships* in Seville, Spain and all expectations pointed to rowing being added to the *2008 Paralympics* at the next FISA conference in April 2005. Accentuating these expectations was the growing excitement among Chicagoans that a serious effort would be launched to bring the *2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games* to this great city of Broad Shoulders.

The informal meeting provided Dr. Ed Melian, an adaptive rowing competitor, an opportunity to test current designs by **WinTech Racing** and **Chosen Valley Canoe** while offering insights on product improvement. As important, the event provided Mitch Carr, Larry Labiak, Cherrie Ong and Blythe Hiss a first-time look at indoor rowing and its possibilities for those with disabilities.

Set against the backdrop of the 9th Annual Chicago Indoor Rowing Championships, it was our hope that this initiative would provide clarity and insight hence framing future discussions and open avenues for cooperative program development. The event exceeded our conservative expectations. Simply stated, all participants contributed constructive thoughts on program and hardware development that would make indoor and on-water rowing accessible to all.

We were ambitious and arranged an International Internet race with the cooperation of **Digital Racing** and their *RowPro* application. Since we anticipated participants with visual disabilities, we also installed *ErgChatter* that announces performance data at regular intervals.

While we were frustrated by glitches with Internet racing, our exhibit succeeded in introducing over 200 individuals to the possibilities of indoor rowing. It also afforded us the opportunity to meet Linda Mastandrea, *Chicago 2016 vice president for sport and accessibility* and become more familiar with the importance of the *Paralympic* component of Chicago's bid for the *2016 Olympic Games*.

Mayor Daley's Holiday Sports Festival 2007: December 28/30, 2007

Chicago Indoor Rowing was invited by *Chicago 2016* to offer attendees to the annual *Sports Festival* an opportunity to experience indoor rowing. Although the general public may be perplexed by the notion of indoor rowing, by the end of the 3-day event that started on December 28th, more than 2,520 and perhaps as many as 3,700 youngsters, parents and grandparents had rowed their first 100+ meters with enthusiastic glee. Many came back for more as they challenged their siblings, cousins and friends to beat their score.

7 Indoor Rowing machines were available but only five were originally setup. We didn't expect what was to follow. Within the first hour, lines grew as attendees became intrigued with indoor rowing and the *Fish Game* on the computer monitor. To accommodate more first-time rowers, the *4-Minute Fish Game* was replaced by a *2-Minute Distance Challenge*. The lines still grew. We brought out the remaining 2 indoor rowing machines and changed the time to a *1-Minute Distance Challenge*. The waiting time became acceptable as those in line learned from those rowing. By days end, at the rate of seven every 2 to 3 minutes, 1,000 to 1,200 *Future Olympians* between the age of 6 and 15 had experienced the idea of rowing for the first time. The same excitement played out for the remaining days of the *Festival*.

New Adaptive Seat Tested

The *Festival* also allowed us to test the latest prototype seat developed by **Chosen Valley Canoe** allowing those with disabilities to participate in the indoor rowing experience. One of the indoor rowers was also made available to athletes competing in the *Wheelchair Basketball Tournament* as part of our testing/development program. The response was so encouraging that the **Chicago Indoor Rowing Championships (CIRC)** will host an *Adaptive Exhibition* as part of its annual competition to be held at Horner Park on February 16th 2008
